

## AAUW California Re-Vote Scheduled for January 9-11, 2018

The September 2017 member vote to return AAUW California to a Public Benefit Corporation failed because of 26 "No" votes. Although 99% of votes were "Yes," it was not enough. Our state's corporate regulations require a unanimous "Yes" vote to change the status of a corporation.

AAUW California will conduct a re-vote January 9-11, 2018 in hopes of avoiding costly and time-consuming legal options.

The FAQ piece has been updated and expanded on the AAUW California website and can be downloaded and distributed to your members or included in your branch newsletter. Encourage your members to thoroughly read this piece and address any additional questions or need for clarification to governance@aauw-ca.org. It is critical that all members voting cast a "Yes" vote to change the status to a Public Benefit Corporation in order to move the organization forward.



The Adverse Childhood Experience Study (ACE) sheds light on the exposure to domestic violence and trauma has on children. With an increasing number (both locally and globally) of children witnessing domestic violence in their home, agencies such as the Coalition are taking a broader look at resiliency factors, children who abuse in later life, and unmitigated trauma. ACE is a profound way to look at the cycle of violence on both a national and community level.

**Dr. Caroline Prijatel-Sutton** is the Executive Director of Coalition For Family Harmony. She holds a Doctorate in Clinical Psychology and has worked with the Coalition for over 10 years. She lives in Ventura County with her husband and son.

The Coalition for Family Harmony is a 40-year-old non-profit agency dedicated to assisting victims of Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault by providing prevention, intervention, and education. 


# Free Documentary Screening Equal Means Equal

## Public Policy Matters!

The AAUW mission is to support educational opportunities for women and girls, and the Dream Act was passed to do just that. Now it's at risk.

DREAMERS –Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA), a federal program started in 2012, has offered opportunity for children brought to this country illegally by their parents to attend school, work, and contribute to our economy without fear of deportation. Children must have arrived before 2007, be under age 16 at the time of arrival, and have no criminal record. The program requires renewal every two years.

There are approximately 800,000 recipients in the program, all in limbo until Congress takes action to renew or end the program. In September of this year, the President issued an order giving Congress six months to draft steps to address the existing DACA recipients and ultimately end the program. The data on the performance of Dreamers shows 97% are either in school or employed; one-quarter are in higher education institutions; and another third in high school and advancing to higher education. Research also shows increase wages and workers in the labor force, reduced number of families in poverty, improved mental health outcomes, and no major adverse impacts from this program.

AAUW National is strongly advocating for Congress to act to protect the DACA recipients —they are part of our communities and they dare to dream of a better future for them and their family. Go to AAUW.org to learn more, voice your support and encourage Congress to act to support our Dreamers. May 2018 inspire all of us to dream and advocate for a stronger, better country and community. 
