### Public Policy - Kathy Long

President Biden's infrastructure plan could leave too many women behind. His roughly \$2 trillion infrastructure plan will help create millions of jobs, but many of the proposed jobs are in historically male-dominated fields and experts worry the plan won't do enough for America's women, who lost more jobs during the pandemic. Women lost \$800 billion in income last year. That's more than the combined GDP of 98 countries. The fallout from the Covid-19 pandemic has been disastrous for women. Stay informed as this progresses through the Federal process, updates to follow.

Broadband updates: In an effort to promote equitable, affordable access to broadband, AAUW Camarillo Public Policy Committee members continue to serve on the Ventura County Digital Inclusion Task Force. Hopefully, county schools will resume full time onsite classroom learning next school year, but hybrid instruction with part-time remote learning is still a possibility. Whatever format instruction takes, students still need Internet access for research and other school projects. In addition, it's predicted that the "new normal" will include ongoing telecommuting and tele-health for many Americans so broadband access will continue to be essential. Very encouraging news comes from the Federal government as the Biden administration has begun to disperse \$10 billion to bring more Americans affordable internet. This could be just the beginning of such funding. Details are here in the Washington Post. Thanks to Betsy Metzgar.

Update on AB 92/AAUW CA - Assembly Bill 92 on Childcare and Preschool Family Fees. Currently, low-income families are eligible to receive state subsidy for childcare and preschool costs. However, in addition to the subsidy, low-income families must pay out of pocket "Family Fees." These fees are not affordable for most families. AB92 would waive the Family Fees until October 2022 and cover the waived fees with state and federal funds. After that, the Family Fees would be assessed on a more equitable sliding scale based on family income. Affordable childcare helps to stabilize the economy. Update: The Bill progressing positively through committees, solid affirmative votes. AAUW California is co-sponsor of AB92 which means our organization considers it the highest priority that the bill be passed. 51 other organizations are on record as supporting the bill. There is no opposition on record. State bills are lagging due to continued focus on COVID.

#### Public Policy in Our Backyard: Master Plan for Camarillo and Oxnard Airports

The Camarillo and Oxnard airports are embarking on an Airport Master Plan "reset", thanks in large part to community members who raised concerns about the lack of transparency and stakeholder representation in the process. An Airport Master Plan is a critical component in ensuring our quality of life as it will map out the future of our airport for the next 20 years. It will have consequences and impacts on our neighborhoods and communities forever. AAUW Camarillo was integral in the fight to put limits on the runway lengths and weight of aircraft, to keep Camarillo a General Aviation airport, NOT a Commercial Airport.

It is going to be a real challenge to preserve our Community General Aviation airport, because....

2 miles from the end of the Camarillo Airport Runway, between Del Norte and Rice Ave, they are building a new Amazon fulfillment warehouse. This warehouse is over 2 million square feet. It will be a 2-story, robotic sorting facility with 62 truck-docks and 259 truck-trailer parking spaces.

The City of Oxnard "Project Bruin" (Amazon was never mentioned by name) Environmental Impact Report traffic analysis for this warehouse states that there will be 119 delivery truck trips to/from "expected to occur during the typical peak one-hour commute periods between 7 - 9 am and 4 - 6 pm". These 5 axle WB-67 semi-trailer tractor trucks will soon be added to our Camarillo 101 Freeway corrid

semi-trailer tractor trucks will soon be added to our Camarillo 101 Freeway corridor, most utilizing the Conejo Grade in-and-out of the LA metropolitan market.

If Amazon semi-trucks are here...are cargo flights far behind? The new Airport Master Plan espouses "Using a variety of engagement techniques, provide new messaging to tell positive stories showing that airports, while they may be a nuisance to a vocal few, are essential infrastructure that benefits the entire County and region". In the Airport Master Plan this airport essential infrastructure is evaluated and recommendations based primarily on economic demand. What we have here is a classic example of the cart before the horse. The Airport Master Plan will in large part be influenced by this huge Amazon "shopping cart" full of demand. Will our Airport need to become a larger "horse" to transport this cargo?

What can we do at this point? The Airport Master Plan "Planning Advisory Committee" guiding this process up until now, has been comprised of 7 representatives of the hotel, tourism, Chamber of Commerces and Economic Development organizations, 6 electeds, and 5 airport related members. This "guiding" planning committee has lacked balanced community representation. Air Quality, health and safety, environmental concerns need to be addressed, and additional stakeholders included. If as stated "Diversity, Inclusion, and Equity will be at the core" of this new Airport Master Plan effort, the "Planning Advisory Committee" must include, along with tourism, economic development interests and electeds, homeowner groups, pilot organizations, agriculture and environmental entities, health and safety agencies, farmworkers and environmental and social justice organizations.

If you would like to see this Airport "Planning Advisory Committee" represent ALL Ventura County stakeholders, let the Camarillo/Oxnard Airport Authority Board know how you feel. The next meeting of the Camarillo/Oxnard Airport Authority Board is Thursday, June 10th at 6:30 pm via zoom. 

# Ventura County Inter Branch Council (IBC) News

AAUW California Chief Financial Officer, Roli Wendorf, organized several meetings between all California IBC branches in the past several months. The meetings focused on the legal limitations of IBC fundraising under federal and state tax law. Our IBCs were not originally set up for fundraising; the purpose was to focus on exchanging ideas and information between AAUW branches. Thus, only a few branches in California have undergone the arduous process of obtaining non-profit status. Our Ventura County IBC has not. After lengthy discussion, our IBC Board decided to forgo further fundraising. The board also voted to: 1) cease annual \$30 payment of IBC dues; 2) donate \$2,150 to three women in Ventura County who are returning junior college students; 3) retain \$500 to secure a venue for the annual IBC Luncheon; 4) and split the final sum between our IBC gift project to KidSTREAM and donation to KidSTREAM of any remaining funds

I was able to bring Larry home from Cedar's yesterday. He is on the mend and has a wonderful, positive attitude. He will be on drip antibiotics for another 8 weeks plus home nursing care. Unfortunately, one of the culprits (a severe bladder/kidney infection which went bonkers when he had his spinal surgery) has not yet been conquered. And his type-2 diabetes flared up. Fortunately, the 3 different procedures done in his back (2 fusions, removal of a huge cyst around his spinal cord, and 2 bilateral decompressions) were successes and he can already stand up straight again. And, fortunately, due to the influence of friends, Larry has a (local) urologist appt at 9 AM Tuesday.

Both of us are so touched by all of you. Your cards, your outpouring of offers to help <u>and help</u> when I so desperately needed it, astounded me. I didn't realize the emotional and physical and mental support I had until you all were so concerned and volunteering to do anything you could for us.

I so deeply appreciate your understanding that I simply wasn't able to communicate with all of you separately. Having to rush Larry to the ER at Cedar's the day after my own spinal surgery and spend the next 8 days there, was all I could manage. Plus, I still don't have my voice back from having the tube down my throat. My children all say, "Quit talking so much, Mom!" But that's pretty hard for me to do!

Again, we are home and on the mend. My son Bob and my daughter Josie are here, spelling me, and doing things that need to be done that are still off-limits for me. Fortunately, bridge, book clubs, bunco, spending time with friends, eating out are not on that list. So I will be seeing all of you soon.
