Public Policy by Kathy Long, Public Policy Chair

Effective January 1, 2022, the City of Camarillo will prohibit the use of expanded polystyrene (EPS) food and beverage containers. The adopted ordinance will prohibit food providers from distributing EPS, and would ban both the sale and distribution of any EPS food packaging, containers and food service ware in the City of Camarillo. <u>www.cityofcamarillo.org/EPSBan</u>. Broad list of business types to be affected, mostly retail food outlets. Environmentally, this is good business; one that many cities and counties have adopted, especially the coastal communities, in efforts to protect our ocean and sea life.

From Merrill Berge: Speaking of packaging: Airport Update and Amazon - are more megadistribution warehouses on our horizon? As the Camarillo City Council continues to hire attorneys specializing in airports and create community input surveys, will Oxnard continue to attract and permit more warehouses on the farmland between Del Norte and Rice Rd? Is the nearly completed 2.3 million square foot Amazon distribution warehouse only a harbinger of what is to come?

Initially, this large piece of farmland was given zoning approval by the City of Oxnard in June, 2012, as the 430 acre Sakioka Farms Business Park Specific Plan. Then, in October, 2020, under an assumed name (Project Bruin - still referred to as such on the Oxnard Planning website) the Amazon "fulfillment center" got the green light to proceed after an environmental review completed in less than 3 months. Subsequently, as we all can see, the Amazon warehouse has now paved over 65 acres. The adjacent Arctic cold storage facility will convert 32 acres. With approximately 230 acres of farmland remaining between this initial construction and the 101 freeway, what will it become?

In a recent Connecting California column (VC Star, Sunday 9/19/21), Joe Mathews relates the following experience while searching for closed CA prison sites: I had to navigate a thoroughfare, Grant Line Road, lined with another breed of warehouses: massive logistics facilities. There were Amazon warehouses big enough to blot out the sun, distribution centers for Home Depot and US Foods, and facilities for third-party logistics companies NFI and APL.

All we need to do is look to San Bernardino to see how one warehouse can quickly become hundreds. Ventura County is home to a deep-water port, a train and rail system, 2 airports, and the 101 and 118 interstate freeways connecting points south and east to the greater LA metropolitan area. Will this Sakioka Farms Business Park in reality become a "warehouse center", piggy-backing on Amazon's location and logistics? And as importantly, what will that mean to the Camarillo Airport? And one last piece: Redistricting ---yes, it does affect you! The County of Ventura, every ten years is required to redraw district boundaries for the Board of Supervisor seats. Requires population balance between the 5 Districts and how neighborhoods and communities are grouped together. Looks at geographic contiguous lines, integrity of neighborhoods and cities, and cannot be drawn for political purposes. One interest group in the Santa Clara Valley/3rd District wants to move the lines to include them more aligned with north Oxnard. How might that impact Camarillo? Take a look. They must complete the process by December 15th. You can have a voice, go to www.ventura.org/redistricting. Will update in November.


