WOMEN IN HISTORY RISE AGAIN!

As many of you know, one of our best known AAUW Camarillo programs, Women in History, was unable to perform in the schools for the last two years. Alas, WIH was struck down by the pandemic. This year the Supt. of Pleasant Valley School District gave us the green light to perform in the schools. As before, we're recruiting performers to make "history come alive" again in the PVSD elementary schools the week of March 6 – 10, 2023. We'll also perform in other schools the following week. To accomplish our WIH program, we are seeking volunteers -- Camarillo moms with schoolchildren, AAUW members, and women who love theatric performance to portray one of five unique and remarkable women:

Susan Butcher (1954-2006)

- Four-time winner of the Iditarod Race in Alaska
- Difficulty with dyslexia and ways she compensated
- The Iditarod and how dogs and musher communicate
- Suitable Costume: anything one would wear to the snow

Jane Goodall (1934 – present)

- Discovered many facts about chimpanzees; is working to save them
- Discussion of how she studied the chimpanzees
- Discussion of environmental problems that chimpanzees face
- Suitable Costume: khaki pants or shorts, khaki or white blouse, and sandals

Nancy Lopez (1957 - present)

- One of the premier figures in women's golf history
- Well known for her spectacular performances in the 1970's and the 1980's
- Did much to increase the popularity of women's professional golf
- Suitable Costume: tee shirt and long pants or golf skirt

Harriet Tubman (1820? - 1913)

- Early life on plantation as slave and ultimate escape
- Underground railroad rescues and activities
- Civil war activities and service to others during that time
- Suitable Costume: long dress or long skirt and blouse--AAUW has some to lend

Laura Ingalls Wilder (1867-1957)

- Author of the Little House Books which she started writing when she was 65
- Stories of her childhood a time very different from the present
- Suitable Costume: prairie dress or long skirt and blouse--AAUW has some to lend

We will be offering an evening WIH Training Meeting for all volunteers in late January 2023 at one of the PVSD schools. We will provide information to all volunteers as soon the location and timeframe are certain. Also, we will provide each performer with a full script, tips on how to perform, and information on how to obtain all the necessary props. For Laura Ingalls Wilder and Harriet Tubman, we will also be lending costumes. We are hoping for a robust attendance. As the community still mourns the passing of Ventura County Supervisor Carmen Ramirez, and now celebrates the appointment of Oxnard City Councilwoman Vianey Lopez to step up to serve as Supervisor of the 5th District, we should take some time to recognize the importance of these "firsts." Carmen was the first Latino woman to serve on the Board, bringing a strong personal perspective to county government public policy. She was an advocate for the underserved minorities, those without access to health care, living wage jobs, and affordable housing. Vianey Lopez brings a strong academic background, along with deep family roots in the Oxnard community. The Latino woman's perspective brings in cultural understanding and empathy to decision-making impacting health, welfare and public safety needs of the community. Another first at the County seat is the selection by the Board of the new Chief Executive Officer, Sevet Johnson. As a minority woman, with strong professional credentials, experience in health care and behavioral health, she is committed to Diversity, Equity and Inclusion. She will bring the many perspectives of her life's experiences to the role of growing a county that embraces all people. Women in leadership create paradigm shifts that make a difference. Scroll down to "Don't have an account?" to reset your password and begin the online process using your email address, not your member number. Once logged in, you will join by selecting 3 membership types: National (\$67), California (\$20) and Camarillo Branch Member \$23 (select CA-0132 Camarillo).

Tips and reminders for the online renewal process:

- Complete the password reset the very first time you login.
- If you don't receive the password reset email, be sure to check your spam folder!

The password reset email will come from: American Association of University Women infosf@aauw.org. Subject Line: AAUW Password Reset Requested.

- Make sure to use your email address and not your member number when logging in.
- Use the same email address you renewed with in 2021.
- "I can log in, but my account says I'm not a member." You have created a new account in error and a duplicate record new member number. National must fix this so please let me know if this happens to you!
