One of our very best AAUW Camarillo programs, Women in History, is in serious need of volunteers to "make history come alive" for Camarillo's children. For more than 35 years women from our AAUW Branch as well as mothers, grandmothers, and aunts of school children, along with some "died in the wool thespians," have come out in droves to portray famous women in the schools. This year we have won the green light of the Supt. of Pleasant Valley School District and other principals of various schools in our area to restore the WIH program. We are busy gathering all the scripts, props, costumes and performance schedules. However, we are falling way behind in our efforts to recruit performers. In order to have performances for all five selected women in the PVSD elementary schools the week of March 6 – 10, 2023, we need a large number of performers. We have also promised to perform in other schools the following week, March 13 – 17, 2023 which would require approximately the same number of volunteers. We're hoping many are willing to perform both weeks.

This year we need our members to step up more than ever. Our group has many members with years of teaching children; others may have assisted by volunteering in their own children's education. Please harken back to the joy in expanding the minds of young students and consider portraying one of the women listed below.

Susan Butcher (1954-2006)

- Four-time winner of the Iditarod Race in Alaska
- Difficulty with dyslexia and ways she compensated
- The Iditarod and how dogs and musher communicate
- Suitable Costume: anything one would wear to the snow

Jane Goodall (1934 – present)

- Discovered many facts about chimpanzees; is working to save them
- Discussion of how she studied the chimpanzees
- Discussion of environmental problems that chimpanzees face
- Suitable Costume: khaki pants or shorts, khaki or white blouse, and sandals

Harriet Tubman (1820? - 1913)

- Early life on plantation as slave and ultimate escape
- Underground railroad rescues and activities
- Civil war activities and service to others during that time
- Suitable Costume: long dress or long skirt and blouse--AAUW has some to lend

Laura Ingalls Wilder (1867-1957)

- Author of the *Little House* Books which she started writing when she was 65
- Stories of her childhood a time very different from the present
- Suitable Costume: prairie dress or long skirt and blouse--AAUW has some to lend

Nancy Lopez (1957 – present)

- One of the premier figures in women's golf history
- Well known for her spectacular performances in the 1970's and the 1980's
- Did much to increase the popularity of women's professional golf
- Suitable Costume: tee shirt and long pants or golf skirt

We are offering a WIH Training Meeting to all volunteers on January 31, 2023 from 5:00 – 8:00pm at Dos Caminos School. We will provide each performer with a full script, tips on how to perform, and information on how to obtain all the props necessary. For Laura Ingalls Wilder and Harriet Tubman we will also be offering costumes. Please remember, there's always a bit of a thrill in immersing oneself in acting to be another – it's even better when your "acting" also educates young minds to understand the important roles women have played throughout history. GOV TREK -- A New AAUW California Program to Inspire Girls to Become Political Leaders

AAUW California is announcing a new virtual statewide program, Gov Trek. The goal is to address the shortage of women in political leadership roles by inspiring a new generation to pursue careers in public service and elected office. Gov Trek is open to any girl currently enrolled as a California high school junior or senior, whether in public, private, home, or continuation high schools. Students can register online on a first come, first served basis. The registration deadline is January 14, 2023. The program is free, can accommodate 150 students, and begins **January 28, 2023, concluding April 22, 2023**

Program Highlights

•AAUW California program designed and delivered at no cost to students or branches •Format consists of five 2-hour, virtual, Saturday sessions

•OUR ROLE TO SERVE AS VOLUNTEERS TO FACILITATE BREAK-OUT SESSIONS. 6 VOLUNTEERS WOULD BE NEEDED.

•Students participate in interactive group activities that include hearing from women legislators, engaging in career exploration, attending public government agency meetings, identifying public policy issues that matter, learning about the components of a political campaign, and more.

•Program culminates in a team competition to create a realistic political campaign simulation with chance for students to earn prizes.

What Role Do Branches Play?

•Main role is to promote the program using provided customizable materials and suggested promotional strategies.

•Designate a Gov Trek Branch Coordinator.

•Members encouraged to volunteer as a Breakout Room Facilitators for one or more of the Saturday sessions.

NEWS FROM AAUW California : On November 9, 2022, the AAUW California Board of Directors voted to terminate its account with Twitter effective immediately. This proposal was brought forth by the Public Policy Committee and approved following thoughtful and careful discussion.

The decision was based on a number of actions taken by Elon Musk both before and since his takeover of this social media platform. Primarily, we are concerned that the incidence of hate speech, disinformation, discriminatory and misogynistic rhetoric, and the spread of dangerous and divisive theories will continue to rise under his stewardship. This is not a platform with which AAUW California can any longer associate.

Additional reasons for this decision are laid out in greater detail in the <u>press</u> <u>release</u>. If your branch supports this action, we are asking you to assist us in getting the word out about AAUW California's position by submitting the press release to your local media outlets. Note that it can be customized with your branch information or modified, if desired. Please note that you are NOT REQUIRED to do so.

Branches are certainly free to continue using their own Twitter accounts. However, nothing may be posted on Twitter that appears to be sanctioned by or bear the name of AAUW California.

We believe this action affirms AAUW California's commitment to advancing fair and equitable treatment for everybody in our diverse society and its opposition to hate, violence, and harassment against members of any demographic group.
