

Juneteenth and Pride - Time to Celebrate!

Juneteenth is a federal holiday in the United States commemorating the emancipation of enslaved African Americans. Deriving its name from combining "June" and "nineteenth", it is celebrated on the anniversary of the order, issued by Major General Gordon Granger on June 19, 1865, proclaiming freedom for slaves in Texas. [7] Originating in Galveston, Juneteenth has since been observed annually in various parts of the United States, often broadly celebrating African-American culture. The day was first recognized as a federal holiday in 2021, when President Joe Biden signed the Juneteenth National Independence Day Act into law after the efforts of Lula Briggs Galloway, Opal Lee, and others.


PM Book Review



Public Policy by Bea Lutterbeck and Kathy Long (1/2)

MEDICARE FOR ALL LEGISLATION REINTRODUCED IN U.S. HOUSE & SENATE

On Wed. May 17, Medicare for All legislation was reintroduced in the US House (H.R. 3421 by Rep. Jayapal and Rep. Dingell) and Senate (S. 1655 by Sen. Sanders) with a record 112 original cosponsors in the House and 14 original cosponsors in the Senate. The legislation builds on existing Medicare programs to ensure universal health coverage for all U.S. residents, including for reproductive, mental health, and long-term care. The bill would also ensure substance abuse treatment and support for people with disabilities. It would reduce prescription drug costs and eliminate copays, private insurance premiums, and deductibles.

"We live in a country where millions of people ration lifesaving medication or skip necessary trips to the doctor because of cost," said Jayapal. "The United States is the only industrialized nation in the world that doesn't guarantee all its citizens access to health care," said Dingell. "The American people understand, as I do, that health care is a human right, not a privilege," said Sanders, Chairman of the Senate Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions Committee. "

Since 1970, efforts to pass universal healthcare legislation in the U.S. have failed. However, support is growing exponentially, because tracking research has demonstrated that the U.S. has the worst health-care system overall among 11 high-income countries. According to research by the Commonwealth Fund, the U.S. has consistently ranked last in the seven comparative reports it has published since 2004, especially in areas of health access, outcomes, and especially equity, even though it spends the highest proportion of its gross domestic product on health care. Public Policy by Bea Lutterbeck and Kathy Long (2/2)

LEGISLATION: On the Federal level, AAUW National joined in a joint letter, signed by 51 national organizations, sent to the U.S. Department of Education/Secretary Reyes, addressing issues with discrimination targeting youth. The Nondiscrimination on the Basis of Sex in Education Programs or Activities Receiving Federal Financial Assistance: Sexrelated Eligibility Criteria for Male and Female Athletic Teams, stated a complete rejection of bigoted, ignorant, mean-spirited, and discriminatory policies currently being considered by too many legislators, seeking exclusion of youth. This attack on our youth is an attack on civil rights and a violation of Title IX.

U.S. Representative Salud Carbajal 24th District, picked up Ventura and parts of north Oxnard in the last redistricting. Elected in 2017, representing Santa Barbara and now Ventura areas. Representative Carbajal has joined in a bipartisan effort to direct increased federal funding to Fentanyl trafficking, utilizing Dept.of Defense tools and involving Mexico as an active partner. The spikes in fentanyl-related overdose deaths is over 700% in recent years. Ventura County had 181 deaths in 2022. Follow him at Carbajal.house.gov.

STATE legislation moving through the process, with AAUW-CA tracking 36 bills, with priority designation on one that has made it through committees: AB 1245 – Commercial sexual exploitation, child sexual abuse material –social media platforms. Others either sent to Suspense file or still in works. Great work by our California AAUW!

GOV TREK: This virtual program for high school junior and senior girls is designed to elevate the next generation to pursue careers in public service and elected office. Over five two-hour sessions, students will engage in interactive and inspiring activities with exposure to women legislators, career options, and the inner workings of a political campaign. The program will culminate in a group competition to create a realistic campaign simulation. AAUW-CA recently held a Zoom celebration for the first class of graduates for this program-GovTeck. They celebrated the wrap-up with the Best in: Candidate Speech, Campaign Management, Voter Outreach Plan, Campaign Ad & Flyer and Grand Prize for Team. Exciting to see these young women from throughout the state participate and demonstrate interest in women in elected office. Our local chapter is invited to participate next Jan/March, all we need are interested leaders/mentors and members to step-up! We all understand the need for women in elected offices to bring our perspectives and skills to enriching our communities. Interested?? Let us know!

AAUW Camarillo awards scholarships to women CSUCI students who have taken a "non-traditional" path to a college degree and had a break in their education between high school and college. Scholarships range from \$1,500-\$2,000.

- •Identify as a woman enrolled and in good academic standing at CSU Channel Islands.
- •Earn a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0.
- •Be a "non-traditional student," e.g., someone whose family or other obligations required an interruption of several years prior to resuming a college program, or someone who waited until later in life to start college.

National Dues Increase for 2023-2024

AAUW National Dues will increase to \$72 for full year 2023-2024 (of which \$69 is tax-deductible). CA dues \$20 and Branch dues \$23 will remain the same. Your total renewal fee for 2023-2024 is now \$115. Please note that for all members who choose to renew online, you will select National, California and scroll down to Branch #0132 Camarillo when going through the renewal process.

Changes to the Membership Renewal Process

As many of our long-time members know, AAUW Membership renewals for all branch members occurred on an annual basis beginning in May/June each year. New members would also renew in the May/June timeframe so that all members were renewing at the same time even if it was less than a full year from the first month of joining.

The majority of our members who usually renew in the May – July timeframe should have received a renewal reminder email directly from National the week of April 24th which included instructions for online and check renewals.

The AAUW National changes which will mostly affect our newer members as they will now be reminded to renew on a 12-month rolling basis from the first month of joining. For example, if you joined in August or September 2022, you would receive your first renewal reminder email in June. October – December 2022 new members will receive their first reminder email in August.

Honorary life members will be excluded from the reminders since online renewal is not the preferred way to renew for this group.
