

The questions are researched and written by branch members, and members of the community using websites, TV shows such as Jeopardy and text books. Women in History 2024: Help from Home!

Women In History needs help switching our performer database from Microsoft Access to Google Forms or Sheets. Access is a great database program with reports available that help us track performer information and scheduling year after year; however, only one committee member has the program, so we are unable to share the job, which would be ideal. We have started using Google Forms to collect volunteer information and are looking for someone to help us develop reports in Google that will give us the information that Access does but can be shared easily with everyone on the committee. In the long run, having reports that can be shared will enable more people to help with data management and make this portion of the WIH program more efficient.

This is a serious issue for the WIH program. We need a way for more people to access the program so that if there were an emergency for the one person who knows the system, the school schedules and prop groups would be unavailable, making it difficult for the program to work. Last Call for Speech Trek Volunteers

The AAUW-CA Speech Trek contest is up and running, but we need more volunteers. This competition is open to all Western Ventura County high school students who write and perform a 5-6 min judged speech. This will be our fourth year sponsoring this local event where the winning speaker's video goes on to the state AAUW for judging in April. We had the state winner last year! Let's do it again! The students are given this prompt:

If an educated population is essential to a nation's prosperity, then how can we ensure a robust public-school curriculum that is accessible to all and teaches historically accurate information?

We need:

Recruiters: We have email lists of faculty and administrators at the various high schools to pass on our flyer to students

Coaches: We have 3 coaches but hopefully will need more. Most coaching can be given via Zoom. Coaches listen to the students' speeches and offer support and speaking tips.

Judges: The contest will be held two Saturdays in February with the winning video sent to the state by March 1.

Coordinator- make sure the competitions happen before March 1, locate a venue, or if COVID picks up, a Zoom. We have help for these issues.

We have an administrative person who will accept the student participation packets. AAUW-CA has a detailed description of how to run the contest at **AAUW-CA.org/Programs**

Public Policy by Kathy Long

AAUW raised our voices objecting to the gun shows at the Fair grounds. Lots of advocacy by many groups concluded with the Governor signing bills that achieved that goal. Recently Gov. Gavin Newsom signed several gun control measures including a bill that tightens the state's concealed-carry rules and another that imposes a new tax on firearm and ammunition sales. The laws build on Newsom's resolution that the Legislature passed earlier this month calling for a constitutional convention of the states to consider a new amendment on gun control. California has some of the strongest firearm restrictions in the country, each year earning top marks from gun control advocacy organizations such as the Giffords Law Center.

The second major proposal Newsom signed is Assembly Bill 28, landmark legislation by Assemblymember Jesse Gabriel (D-Encino) that will impose an 11% tax on dealers and manufacturers for sales of guns and ammunition. The new law is expected to raise more than \$160 million annually for violence prevention, school safety programs and victim support services.

UPDATE ON BROADBAND/INTERNET: This last week, the Ventura Council of Governments (VCOG) conducted the launch of its regional broadband working group in support of the effort to develop a regional strategy, respond to broadband funding opportunities, and creation of a regional joint powers authority. The effort is funded by the California Public Utilities Commission in recognition that the delivery of Broadband is analogous to any other utility. As required by SB 156, this funding is focused on the development of strategies and establishment of infrastructure resulting in Broadband for All. AAUW had advocated during the legislative process to support this effort, to provide internet access for all!

Public Policy/DEI Committee work underway focused on School Board Project; updates on local Title 1X compliance in our schools; Environmental issues and groundwater sustainability; and health care matters. Join us if interested: kathylong220@gmail.com
