

Public Policy from Kathy Long

AAUW benefits from our affiliation with National and California AAUW in many ways: our local mission and work are guided by them; our projects benefit from experiences and access to information they provide; and their value-added programs are accessible for our use. Our Public Policy committee engages with their legislative proposals and tracks the work to inform our members. Our local elected representatives all have websites and local district offices available for our engagement.

Our newest Washington U.S. Representative, new to our county, is Congressman Salud Carbajal —saludcarbajal.house.gov. He represents our northern part of the county: Ventura, Ojai/Ojai Valley, and parts of Santa Clara Valley/Saticoy. The Congressman recently fought for and secured resources via the National Defense Authorization Act: the Disrupt Fentanyl Trafficking Act, establishing an urgency for our country to work with Mexico to stop the flow of this deadly drug. Fentanyl is the leading cause of death in ages 18-45, estimated 196 deaths every single day in our nation. Ventura County had 181 deaths in 2022, up from 22 in 2017. The Act declared this a National Security Threat, signed by the President. This will bring extra resources to our region to combat this threat.

Our electeds work hard to represent our communities, sometimes un-noticed in the complexities of our lives. I encourage you to take a look at their websites to get a true picture of their work. Senator Monique Limon just posted the Year In Review, a short video that captures her work –one of the better videos I've seen. Go to SD19.senate.ca.gov to see for yourself. Annual dues are \$115 (\$72 National, \$20 CA, \$23 Branch).

1.Mail a check for \$115 payable to "AAUW Camarillo Branch" to: AAUW Camarillo Branch, P.O. Box 862, Camarillo, CA 93011.

2. Online at AAUW National – my.aauw.org

Scroll down to "Don't have an account?" to reset your password and begin the online process using your email address, not your member number. Once logged in, you will join by selecting 3 membership types: National (\$72), California (\$20) and Camarillo Branch Member \$23 (select CA-0132 Camarillo).

Tips and reminders for the online renewal:

Complete the password reset the first time you login.

• If you don't receive the password reset email, be sure to check your spam folder!

The password reset email will come from: American Association of University Women infosf@aauw.org. Subject Line: AAUW Password Reset Requested.

- Make sure to use your email address and not your member number when logging in.
- Use the same email address you renewed with in 2022.
- You can login but account says you're not a member. You have created a new account in error and a duplicate record new member number.
 National must fix this so please let me know if this happens to you!
